TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER					

Upon consideration of Plaintiffs' Verified Complaint, Motion for Temporary

Restraining Order, and Memorandum in Support, the Court finds as follows:

1. The constitutional rights of Plaintiffs are being and will continue to be violated by the Environmental Review Appeals Commission ("ERAC");

- Plaintiffs will suffer irreparable harm if ERAC is permitted to continue with the one-hour appeals described in the Verified Complaint and Motion for Temporary Restraining Order;
- 3. Plaintiffs allege that they have no adequate remedy at law;
- 4. Greater injury will be inflicted on Plaintiffs by the denial of a temporary restraining order than would be inflicted upon Defendants by the issuance of such relief; and
- The granting of injunctive relief will not disserve the public interest.Accordingly, it is therefore ORDERED, ADJUDGED, and DECREED that:
- 1. A temporary restraining order is issued immediately. Plaintiffs shall not be required to post security.

- 2. ERAC is temporarily enjoined and restrained, directly or indirectly, from proceeding with the one-hour hearings in Plaintiffs' appeals described in Exhibit 1 to the Verified Complaint.
- 3. ERAC is ordered to vacate the one-hour appeals described above until further notice.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
